1. Country to reopen 'in 120 days'

Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha says his government plans to reopen the country within the next 120 days, despite the risk of a further rise in Covid-19 infections. "The time has now come for us to look ahead and set a date for when we can fully open our country and start receiving visitors," the PM said during a live TV broadcast to the nation yesterday. Gen Prayut said a speedy reopening of the country was an important way to begin mitigating the immense economic hardship inflicted by the pandemic on people who had lost their ability to earn an income.

2. CCSA seeks Phuket Sandbox revisions

The Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration's (CCSA) sub-committee has asked the Tourism Authority of Thailand to revise the Covid-19 control plan proposed for its Phuket Tourism Sandbox programme, due to kick off on July 1. A revision is required before it can be forwarded to the CCSA's main committee on Friday, Apisamai Srirangson, assistant spokeswoman for the CCSA, said on 16 June. Suggestions made by the Department of Disease Control as well as the CCSA's sub-committee at a meeting on 16 June will be incorporated into the revision to improve the effectiveness of Covid-19 control, she said.

3. Thailand to ban imports of plastic scrap within 5 years Source: The Nation (Link)

PCD director-general Athapol Charoenshunsa insisted on 16 June that the government had no policy of importing plastic waste. "We have urged the Thai Customs Department and related authorities to return containers of plastic waste to their country of origin," he said. However, Athapol conceded that the Natural Resources and Environment Ministry allows imports of plastic scrap to feed the industrial sector, with 150,807 tonnes shipped last year and 44,307 tonnes from January to April this year. But he said importation is gradually being reduced to zero, while the government is now actively promoting domestic recycling of plastic waste. Thailand had also banned importation of electronic waste in September last year, penalising violators with fines and imprisonment, Athapol noted
